<u>FALL</u>

- Talk to your counselor to make sure you're on track to graduate and meet college admission requirements. Ask to see your unofficial transcript to find out your GPA and how many credits you've earned.
- Consider taking the PSAT, October 11, 2017. The PSAT is the National Merit Scholarship qualifying exam and is a good practice test for the SAT. If interested, sign up in the SHS guidance office by October 7, 2017. Fee is \$15.
- Consider taking the ASVAB, November 15, 2017. The ASVAB is a multiple-aptitude battery that measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military. It is administered annually to more than one million military applicants, high school, and post-secondary students.
- Make a list of colleges that you wish to research online.
- Research college entrance and scholarship requirements. Utilize the college comparison chart found on the SHS website <u>www.shscounseling.pbworks.com</u>
